The Rover Sports Register National Rally and Dinner. 5th-7th July 2019

The RSR was formed in 1954 and was the car club section of the Rover Owners Association. The ROA was run by the Rover Company and included a number of Land Rover clubs formed at that time

The RSR welcomes enthusiasts and owners of all vehicles with a Rover badge to join in their activities, from bicycles through to the last Rover 75s and vehicles made by Land Rover.

The event this year was centred on Bowden Hall, in the Cotswolds, with a barbeque in the grounds of the hall on Friday evening. Saturday there was a road run which took the cars through Bourton-on-the-Water for a stop at the Cotswold Motoring Museum. The evening was rounded off with a sumptuous dinner in the hall.

The rally was held at the Cotswold Airport, Cirencester on Sunday, where the cars were assembled in class order from Class A, 1904 to 1933, right through the different models of cars to Class N, the Rover 75, (the R 40)





G526WAC was in Class P designated as Land Rover and Range Rover. I wondered if the RSR was ready to accept the Discovery and Freelander. When I enquired which was the class for G526WAC, I was told that Discoverys were in Class P !!! Perhaps Class P will include Discovery and Freelander next year.

The classes were judged by the 'self-judging' system, you can't vote for your own car, and Class P was won by James Taylor's Range Rover.





The airport is in operation with flights for customers during the day. The only Bristol Britannia in existence was open for RSR

members to explore, with an ex pilot available to show the visitors around the aircraft. XM496 named Regulus during RAF service, made the last flight into Cotswold Airport on 14th October 1997.

A very enjoyable weekend in delightful countryside, and I hope to enter a G-WAC next year in the Discovery class.
